The Lawns

You will notice that the hoops have been moved on the lawns, although the surface of the lawn is good through the hoops due to the dry weather and the constant hits the hoops take from the balls they have become loose, the only remedy is to move them.

Please take care when putting the hoops out, do not insert them too far into the ground, it will probably require a tap with the mallet to install and the hoop lifter at the end of the session to remove them. Please do not kick the hoops to loosen them.

Our contractors Perspective Landscapes have continued with the work on the lawns, and do not plan to reduce the cut height any further. Despite having turned on the watering system the current dry weather is having its effect on the lawns and in places it has been hard for the water to penetrate the surface, this is being treated to improve the situation. I am sure you will all have noticed that in some places the lawn is lightning fast and only requires the smallest of taps.



Footware

I know it is very tempting to wear open-toed sandals during the hot weather but this is not a good idea whilst playing croquet, all too easily a ball can ricochet and hit your foot causing an injury. Please respect the clubs requirement to wear closed toed shoes.

PLEASE if anyone has any collapsible chairs that they no longer require MCC would be very grateful to have them in the shed, for use during matches and social events
