Lawns

Perspective are continuing with the summer programme of lawn maintenance with two to three cuts per week. They are intending to treat the lawns again with slow release fertilizer and carry out spot weeding in the coming week. We also plan to carry out some hand weeding to improve the playing surface.

We are making good use of the watering system. This is now used every day and, along with a wetting agent applied to the grass, has made a significant difference to the playing surface. At present there is no forecast of any significant rainfall.





It has been reported that some members are lifting the equipment trolleys onto the lawns at the end of play to collect the hoops and posts, **please do not do this** as the wheels and the trolley support can damage the lawn.



Hoops

The top of the carrots (the angled bits on the bottom of the hoop) do not have to be level with the lawn surface, they can be 12 mm ($\frac{1}{2}$ ") above the lawn surface when putting the hoops out. If the hoop is too low or loose sand is available in the rear shed to insert into the hole to pack it out. A mallet may then be required to insert the hoop correctly.
